Principle Report - Sam Hicks

- Could have retired 4 years go but wanted to get us back to normal after Covid
- Have been preaching on the weekends during this time, to senior centers, etc
- Felt a call to make the move; going to seminary full time starting in January
- Going to change careers to be a Methodist preacher
- Feel good about being back to "normal" at LWE
- Biggest strength in LWE is PTO
 - Covered playscapes because of PTO
 - o Things will be different with new principal and board, new traditions and changes
 - Mighty mustangs program is new tradition

Guest Speaker – Dr. Norton: Bond Presentation

- Increase of 3300 students in next 10 years; this will be a 6-7 year bond
- Still working on athletic piece, glad others passed in last bond election
- Many major projects in the works
 - o Technology, guard houses, new parking lot, video wall at PAC, security on various campuses
 - o Design of HS #2, ES #8
 - New road for HS #2 to HW71 and emergency egress to Hamilton Pool
- Long range planning for HS #2
- No athletic facilities except for gym in new school
- Safety/security concerns
- New bond called in June 2023
- 40% athletics, 30% other performance based extracurricular activities
- Challenges without this:
 - o Overcrowding
 - scheduling/practice limits
 - Student travel/bussing
 - safety/security
 - o Where to store equipment, instruments, etc
 - o Property was purchased to take traffic off 620...if bussing back that doesn't work
 - o Bussing students for athletics, etc will take away from drivers for regular transport
 - Increased sharing of weight rooms/training
- HS #2 open fall 2027; \$143 million
- Football, baseball, softball, tennis, track, grass practice fields, locker rooms, multi-use activity centers
- Need equitable facilities at all schools
- LTHS has been added onto 7 times already we have efficiencies and designs to maximize space and build from scratch
- Artificial turf on baseball/softball better for long term can be used year round and rented out for other things
- Baseball fields almost 40 years old need updates
- Renovations to cavalier stadium for things like graduation want to be able to open it to more people; 7400 seats right now want to get to 12000 (we have one of smallest stadiums)
- Women's field house addition and renovation plus adding for lacrosse, which is coming
- Golf amenities, mens field house, lighting, fencing, more seating at track stadium
- Replace turf and track at middle schools; HB even more locker room, fields, sound etc
- Added in replacement of turf to BCMS and LTHS now so we don't have to have another bond before it needs replacement
- New HS has capacity of about 2000; 3500 at LTHS 2 different sizes so they aren't competing against each other.
- Facilities at HS#2 will be less/smaller
- Lowest tax rate in LTISD ever
- We are a recapture district and send alot of money back to state; bond does not go into the recapture, all stays
 in the district
- No tax rate increase
- LTISD homeowners get 20% reduction in appraised value through homestead exemption
- All school proposition bonds must say "this is a property tax increase"
- Early voting until 11/3; election day 11/7
- Only 4600 people have voted up until 10/31
